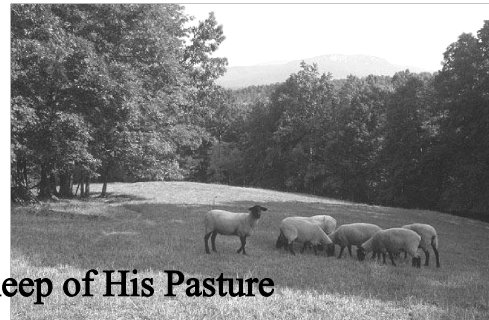

Hosted at Meadow View

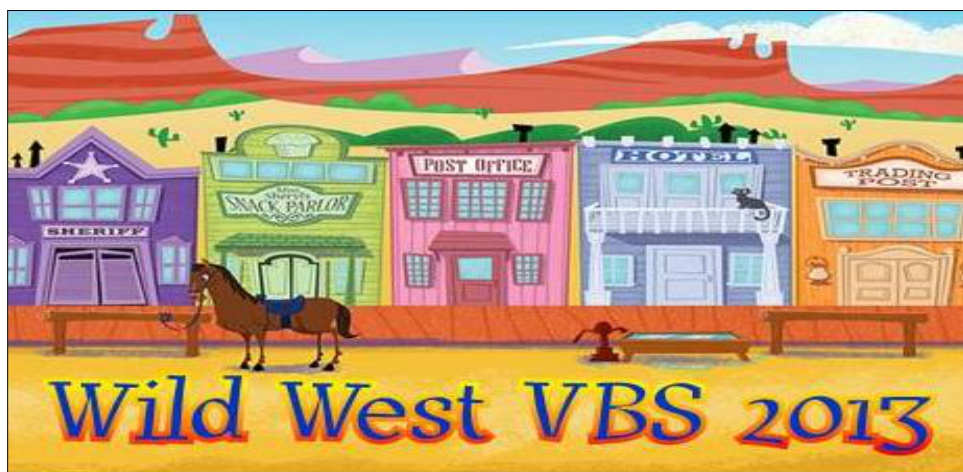
Tuesday, July 9th at 7:00 PM

GOD'S LOVE TO CREATION

God can only be known by humans if he reveals himself to them. God is invisible (Col. 1:15). He has not been seen by any human (1 John 4:12), nor can he be seen (1 Tim. 6:16). But God has revealed himself to us in some significant ways (Rom. 1:19). God is revealed supremely in Christ (John 1:18), but he is also seen in conscience (Rom. 2:14-15) and creation (Rom. 1:20).

David, who spent a lot of time contemplating the heavens while caring for his flock of sheep (cf. Psa. 8:3-4), wrote, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge" (Psa. 19:1-2 NIV).

What kind of God does the creation declare him to be? It declares him to be a living God. Nothing comes from nothing. Without a pre-existing God our universe couldn't have been created. It declares him to be a lofty God. We know that an effect cannot be greater than its cause. One can't flood the world with one twenty-gallon barrel of water. Ours is a massive 20-billion-light-year universe. God's power has to be greater than the sum-total of all of the universe's energy.

It also declares him to be a loving God. Psalm 33:5 reads, "The LORD loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of his unfailing love" (NIV). How can the world be full of God's love if there is in this world innocent suffering, death, war, injustice, etc.? The Bible affirms that these are present in the world, not because of God's perfect will, but because of man's sinful will (Rom. 5:12). God created the potential for evil by creating man with free-will, but man has actualized that evil by disobeying God's will. In spite of the evil, God's love is seen in his faithfulness to his creation.

Matthew 5:45 speaks of God's love to his friends and his foes with these words: "He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous." God is preserving his universe as a stable place for man to be brought to repentance. Have you considered that the very fact that we are able to engage in science is proof of God's love? God is preserving the universe in such a way that we can depend upon its laws to function consistently and predictably.

Our God is living, lofty, and loving to his creation. "LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" (Psa. 8:1 NIV).
