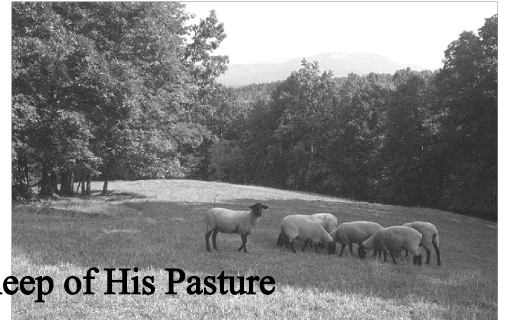

"TESTIMONY TO JESUS"

Josephus was a Jew who was born in Jerusalem in A.D. 37. He was the son of a priest named Matthias. During the Jewish-Roman War of A.D. 66-73 he was initially a reluctant fighter on the Jewish side. However, after he was captured and freed by the Romans he tried to convince the Jews to surrender. After the war he moved to Rome where he became a prolific author.

Josephus' largest work is called *The Antiquities of the Jews*. Written in A.D. 93-94, it is a massive, 20-book work that records the history of the Jews from the creation of the world. This work is well-respected by scholars. Much of what we know about the world of Jesus comes from this work. For instance, we all know that Salome was the name of Herodias' daughter who danced for Herod and requested John's head on a platter (cf. Matt. 14:1-12), but we only know her name from Josephus (*Antiquities* 18:136). The value of Josephus was recognized early on, for Eusebius of Caesarea quotes Josephus a lot in his fourth-century work, *Church History*.

Josephus made an incredible statement about Jesus as follows: "Now, there was about this time Jesus, a wise man, if it be lawful to call him a man, for he was a doer of wonderful works--a teacher of such men as received the truth with pleasure. He drew over to him both many of the Jews, and many of the Gentiles. He was Christ; and when Pilate, at the suggestion of the principal men amongst us, had condemned him to the cross, those that loved him at the first did not forsake him, for he appeared to them alive again the third day, as the divine prophets had foretold these and ten thousand other wonderful things concerning him; and the tribe of Christians, so name from him, are not extinct at this day" (18:63).
