

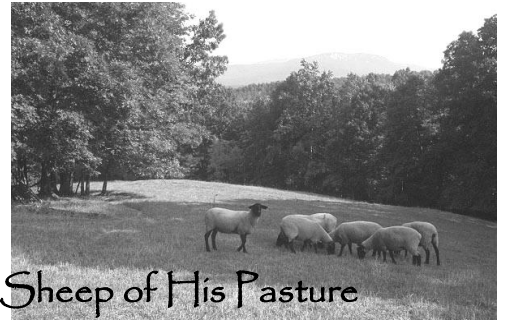

"A God Who Weeps"

I've never been accused of being the most sensitive guy around. I'm not proud to say that there can be a hardness in my soul to the suffering of others when I judge the suffering to be the result of their own making. It's hard for me to mourn over the death of a drunk driver in the same way that I mourn over the death of the victims of his crime.

God isn't as some touchy-feely sorts would make him out to be. His parenting of his people isn't akin to the doting grandfather model. He allows pain to come to his children for their ultimate good (Heb. 12:5-11). However, God isn't cold and sadistic. He is a God who hurts when his people hurt, even if their pain is the result of their own sins and is for their good.

Judges records a very sad and sinful period of Israel's history. Between the death of great leaders like Moses and Joshua and the rise of kings like Saul and David, Israel went through multiple cycles of sin, servitude, sorrow and salvation. In chapter 10 of the book, the people turn from God to the false gods of the pagans. As a result God sold them into the hands of the Ammonites and Philistines who afflicted Israel. The people cried out to God for deliverance, and he initially said, "Go and cry out to the gods you have chosen. Let them save you when you are in trouble!" (v. 14 NIV). The Israelites responded by repentance and the forsaking of their false gods (v. 15-16a). Then the prophet makes this amazing statement: "And [God] could bear with Israel's misery no longer" (v. 16b NIV).

Judges 10:16 has parallels in other places in Scripture. "In all their distress [God] too was distressed" (Isa. 63:9 NIV). "When Jesus saw [Mary] weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping...Jesus wept" (John 11:33a, 35 NIV).

Aren't you humbled by the fact that God really does feel the pain of his sinful creatures?! May we all allow God's compassionate example to move us to "weep with them that weep" (Rom. 12:15 KJV).
