

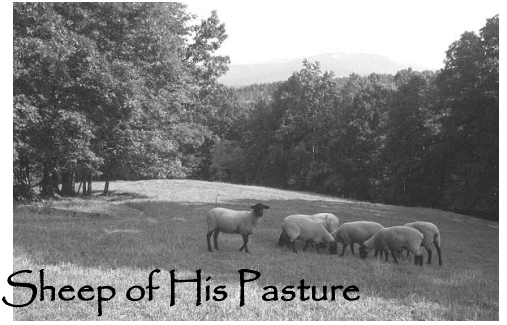

" Repentance Illustrated"

The Bible in both testaments teaches that people must repent in order to be accepted by God. This was the consistent theme of Jesus' preaching. For instance, he said twice in the same conversation, "But unless you repent, you too will all perish" (Luke 13:3, 5 NIV).

What is repentance? There are several ways to answer that question. We could look up the original words lying behind the English "repent" in Hebrew and Greek lexicons. However, perhaps the clearest answer to the question is to be found in biblical passages that illustrate repentance.

Luke 15 contains 3 parables which Jesus intended as a rebuke against the Pharisees' negative attitude toward Jesus' eating with sinners. Jesus said after the first parable, "I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent" (v. 7 NIV). The third and best-known parable in this series, The Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32), serves as a powerful illustration of repentance.

The prodigal son in his sin wandered far from home, wasted his wealth on his lusts, and was so impoverished that he was reduced to feeding pigs. The hurtful consequences of his sin motivated soul searching on his part (v. 17). This corresponds to the teaching that God's chastening hand and our sorrow over sin motivates repentance (Rev. 3:19; 2 Cor. 7:10). He remembered how good his father had been to all in his household (v. 17). This corresponds to Paul's statement that God's goodness motivates our repentance (Rom. 2:4). The prodigal made a decision to leave the country of sin and to return to his father (v. 18). Repentance is a change of heart--a decision to leave sin and to return to righteousness--in its most basic form (cf. Matt. 21:28-32). This now penitent son acted on that decision and humbly returned to his father (vv. 20-21). Genuine repentance bears the fruit of reformed behavior (Matt. 3:8; Luke 3:8; Acts 26:20).

Thus, the definition of repentance supplied by The Parable of the Prodigal Son is as follows: Repentance is a change of heart toward sin and righteousness which is motivated by godly sorrow and God's goodness, and which leads to a reformation of life.
