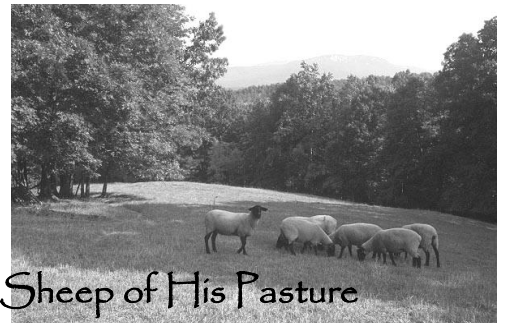

"Remember God's Blessings"

The dessert through which God led Israel for forty years was barren. It would seem to be a nearly impossible task to feed a nomadic group with over 600,000 adult men and an unknown number of women and children. God, however, is almighty, and he miraculously provided manna for them every morning until they crossed the Jordan River and entered Canaan (Exod. 16:35).

God provided a sufficient amount of manna for each day. The Israelites were not allowed to store it up over night, else it would be full of maggots and stink (Exod. 16:19-20). However, the Israelites were allowed to gather up a double portion of manna on Friday and keep it over night without the manna decaying (Exod. 16:21-27), since God provided no manna on the Sabbath (Saturday).

There was one other exception to the general rule that manna couldn't be saved overnight. God commanded Moses and Aaron to gather up 2 liters of manna in a jar to be stored for all generations within the Ark of the Covenant (Exodus 16:32-34). The Hebrews' writer refers to the 3 things that were kept in the Ark of the Covenant--"the gold jar of manna, Aaron's staff that had budded, and the stone tablets of the covenant" (Heb. 9:4 NIV). Interestingly, between the time of Moses and Solomon the jar of manna and Aaron's staff were lost. At the time that Solomon built the temple we are told, "There was nothing in the ark except the two stone tablets that Moses had placed in it at Horeb" (1 Kings 8:9 NIV).

Why did God command Moses to save a jar full of manna? God said, "Take an omer of manna and keep it for the generations to come, so they can see the bread I gave you to eat in the wilderness when I brought you out of Egypt" (Exod. 16:32 NIV). It was so that Israel would have a perpetual reminder of God's gracious provisions for them; it was so that they wouldn't forget. God has been so good to us (Acts 17:25; James 1:17; et al.), but it is so easy to forget that. We all need to build into our lives reminders of God's blessings. We all need to store our jars of manna.
