

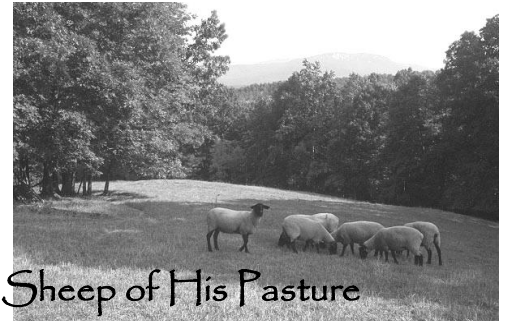

## " Reading Scripture Publicly "

How important is reading scripture in the church's worship?

Most would probably say "I guess public reading of the Bible has its place, but it is nowhere near as important as preaching, singing, and communion."

Perhaps, but we need to ask some questions about reading. Why did the apostle Paul tell the young evangelist Timothy, "Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture?" (1Tim. 4:13)

The exhortation to read means to "devote yourself, or give attention to it." Also the word for reading means "read aloud."

The examples of public reading are many:

1. Remember the great things which happened when the Ethiopian, riding along in his chariot, read Isaiah aloud (Acts 8:30)
2. Remember how the great leader Moses read the law to God's people, Israel? (Exodus 24:7)
3. Meditate on the fact that Ezra read the law to Israel from "early morning until midday...and the people were attentive to the Book of the Law" (Neh. 8:3)
4. Recall that Jesus read from the scroll of Isaiah when he went to the synagogue in Nazareth (Luke 4:16-20)

Now, was all this reading done because the people had few copies of Scripture? That may be part of the reason for the practice, but it does not explain all of it!

There is a place for silent reading to yourself, or looking at a projection screen and quietly seeing the words. BUT there is a mystical experience when one hearts the words of God read well.

God's words are powerful.

Let's supplement our silent reading with some words the ears can hear.
