

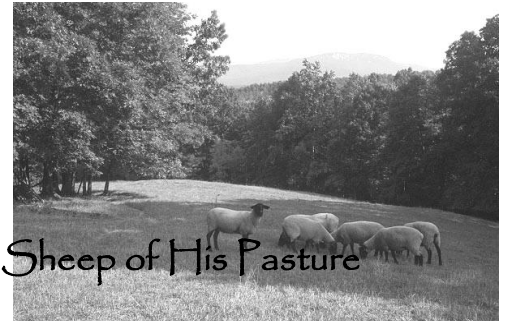

" My Sacrifice, O God "

Donald Trump sure is in the news a lot! Recently, he was at the Family Leadership Summit in Ames, Iowa. At that event he commented, "People are so shocked when they find out I am a Protestant. I am a Presbyterian and I go to church and I love God and I love my church."

Frank Luntz asked Trump if he ever asked God for the forgiveness of his sins. Trump answered, "I am not sure I have. I just go on and try to do a better job from there. I don't think so. I think if I do something wrong, I think, I just try and make it right. I don't bring God into that picture. I don't."

While I would never want to denigrate the importance of reforming one's life after sin (Trump: "I just go on and try to do a better job from there.") or of making restitution after sin (Trump: "...I just try and make it right."), neither of these actions goes nearly far enough. Even though Trump says, "I don't bring God into that picture," sinning automatically brings God into the picture. Remember after he had committed adultery with Bathsheba and murdered her husband to cover it up, David said to God, "Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight" (Psalm 51:4 NIV). The thing that makes sin so deadly is that it is an offense to God.

The only way to deal successfully with sin is to make things right with God. Again, after David's adultery and murder, he said to God, "You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings" (Psa. 51:16 NIV). Though God allowed animal sacrifices to be brought to make atonement for unintentional sin, he allowed no sacrifice to atone for defiant sin (Num. 15:27-31). The sin of murder was a capital offense and no sacrifice was allowed to make atonement for it (Exod. 21:12-14). But David went on to say, "My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise" (Psa. 51:17 NIV). In response to David's sacrifice of a contrite heart offered to him, God exercised his divine prerogative to allow his mercy to trump the just requirement of the law, and he forgave David (2 Sam. 12:13).

The truth for Trump and everyone else is that the only way that God's mercy will trump (pardon the pun) his justice, is for us to ask God to forgive us with broken, contrite hearts (1 John 1:9).
