### "We Will Not All Sleep"

Last Tuesday I did a funeral for a woman who was a member of the congregation that I used to preach for in Bossier City, Louisiana. This sister was one month shy of 104 when she passed from this life. There were 53,364 people in America who were 100 years old or older in 2010. In light of the fact that the population of the United States was 308,110,000 in 2010, that means that less than two-one-hundredths of one percent of Americans will reach 100 years of age.

Though there is a very low statistical chance that any one of us will make it to 100 years of age, there is a very high chance that we will die. Ethan asked, "Who can live and not see death, or who can escape the power of the grave?" (Psa. 89:48 NIV). According to the statistics there is a 100 percent chance than you and I will die, for every American who has ever lived has died, even if they made it to 104 or beyond.

However, there is an inherit weakness in statistics. They calculate general probabilities based upon past realities. Statistics are not divine prophecies that infallibly foretell the future. While there is a good statistical chance that we will all die, if we are allowed to live long enough, we won't die. Paul said so by inspiration. He wrote, "Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed" (1 Cor. 15:51 NIV). Paul is not quoting the babies in a church nursery, but he is speaking of what will happen when Jesus comes again. "Sleep" is used in this passage as a metaphor for death (cf. Dan. 12:2; Acts 7:60). Christians who are alive at the second coming of Jesus won't have to die physically. Jesus will destroy death at his coming (1 Cor. 15:25-26; Rev. 20:4), and he will change mortal bodies of living Christians into immortal ones (1 Cor. 15:53-54).

While it is important to live recognizing one's mortality, it is even more important to live recognizing the immanency of Jesus' coming. Notice that in Paul's statement he wrote, "WE will not all sleep, but WE will all be changed" (emphasis mine). Paul lived as though Jesus' coming would precede his death. He closed 1 Corinthians by saying, "Come, Lord!" (16:24 NIV).
