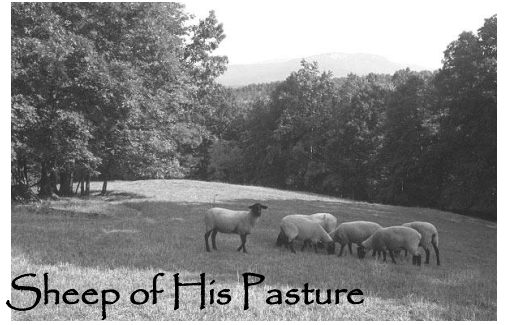

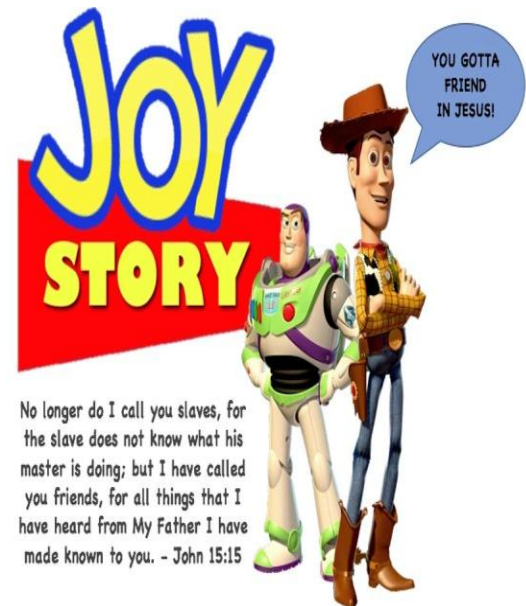
SYS- June 20th, will be at Westhill C of C, in Corsicana . Meet at MVCC at 5:20p.m. to ride the van.

"Who Knows?"

"Who knows?" has become a part of our daily speech. In fact, it is even defined by Wiktionary as "[a] rhetorical question asked to express the idea that anything could happen."

This phrase also occurs three times in the Old Testament. David said, "While the child was still alive, I fasted and wept. I thought, 'Who knows? The LORD may be gracious to me and let the child live'" (2 Sam. 12:22 NIV). Joel wrote, "Who knows? He may turn and relent and leave behind a blessing—grain offerings and drink offerings for the LORD your God" (Joel 2:14 NIV). And an Assyrian king said, "Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish" (Jon. 3:9 NIV).

Each passage has a context of God's chastisement/judgment for sin. David had committed adultery, and God was afflicting his child from that illicit relationship. Joel wrote of a divinely sent locust plague for Judah's unfaithfulness. And Jonah had announced Nineveh's immanent doom.

By saying "who knows?" the kings and the prophet were expressing their hope that repentance might cause God mercifully to remove his judgment. But, with David, it did not; his son died after 7 days (2 Sam. 12:18). We don't know how things played out in the situation described by Joel. However, in the case of Nineveh, God did not destroy the city after 40 days, but spared it for another 150 years (Jon. 3:10; cf. Nahum).

God said, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways" (Isa. 55:8 NIV). We can all say a hearty "amen" to that. God always keeps his promises (Heb. 6:18; 10:23), and so, if we repent and confess we are always assured of his forgiveness (1 John 1:9). However, when it comes to matters that God hasn't spoken about directly, we should be cautious. God's grace is his own, not ours. We would be wise to say "who knows?" rather than saying, "I think..."
