**Lions**

Most lions living in the wild today live on the African continent. There is only one pocket of lions currently living in Asia. However, in biblical days there were many lions roaming about Palestine.

Lions were especially to be found in the northern mountains and the Jordan River Valley. For Solomon said, "Descend from the crest of Amana, from the top of Senir, the summit of Hermon, from the lions' dens" (Song 4:8 NIV); and Jeremiah wrote, "Like a lion coming up from Jordan's thickets to a rich pastureland, I will chase Babylon from its land in an instant" (Jer. 50:44 NIV). Lions were prevalent enough that the lazy used them as an excuse to not go to work; "The sluggard says, "There's a lion outside! I'll be killed in the public square!" (Prov. 22:13 NIV).

God sometimes used lions as a means to bring judgment on sinners. For instance, relative to the pagans brought in by Assyria to take the Israelites' place in Samaria it is said, "When they first lived there, they did not worship the LORD; so he sent lions among them and they killed some of the people" (2 Ki. 17:25 NIV; cf. 1 Ki. 13:24; 20:36).

Three Israelites are said to have killed lions. When Samson flirted with breaking his Nazarite vow by walking near a vineyard, he killed a lion that ambushed him with his bare hands (Jud. 14:5-6). As a shepherd boy, David killed the lion that threatened his sheep (1 Sam. 17:36; cf. Am. 3:12). Because lions are a threat to people, David's brave warrior, Benaiah, killed a lion that had been trapped in a pit (1 Chron. 11:22).

The safety and security of our eternal state is described by the prophet Isaiah in terms of the conversion of carnivorous predators into herbivores. It is written, "The wolf and the lamb will feed together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox, and dust will be the serpent's food. They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain" (Isa. 65:25 NIV). In contrast to this Paradise, Isaiah describes hell for those "who rebelled against [God]" as a place where "the worms that eat them will not die, the fire that burns them will not be quenched" (66:24 NIV; cf. Mark 9:48).
