

A NATION'S GREATEST WARRIORS

When Elijah was being taken up into heaven, Elisha exclaimed, "My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!" (2 Kings 2:12 NIV).

1 and 2 Kings records Israel's history. After the nation split, the Northern Kingdom was ruled from 931 B.C. until 721 B.C. by 19 kings, all of whom were bad. The kings are the villains of that story. The heroes of the story are the prophets. Perhaps the most well-known prophet of the Northern Kingdom is Elijah. As far as the narrative is concerned, he never fought in a battle. The closest that he came was at Mount Carmel when he ordered that the 450 prophets of Baal be gathered up and executed (1 Kings 18:40). Yet, in spite of the fact that Elijah never donned armor, Elisha calls him "the chariots and horsemen of Israel." Elisha wasn't speaking of the flaming chariot and horses that had parted him from Elijah.

Not everyone agreed with Elisha's description of Elijah. Years before, King Ahab called Elijah the "troubler of Israel" (1 Kings 18:17 NIV). Ahab viewed Elijah as a troubler of the nation because of Elijah's prophecies of judgment upon Israel. Elijah countered Ahab's charge by saying, "I have not made trouble for Israel...But you and your father's family have. You have abandoned the LORD's commands and have followed the Baals" (v. 18 NIV).

When a nation's history is considered from a biblical worldview, those who bring trouble upon it are those who lead the people to abandon God's way. A nation's greatest warriors aren't those who merely serve in that nation's military. Rather, they are those who fight in the realm of ideas to turn the hearts of the people back to God (2 Cor. 10:3-6). Solomon wrote, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin condemns any people" (Prov. 14:34 NIV).

Our nation is corrupt in so many ways. The troublers of America are those who promote evil. If we would fight for nation, it isn't to be done with guns and grenades, nor with griping and gossiping, but with the gospel.
