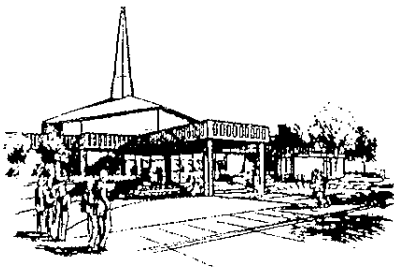

DEFENDING THE FAITH

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect" (1 Pet. 3:15 NIV).

The Greek that lies behind the words "to give an answer" is "pros apologian." The English word "apologetics" is derived from it. Apologetics doesn't refer to saying that you are sorry. Rather, it refers to giving a reasoned defense of the Christian faith.

A lot of work has been done through the centuries in the field of Christian apologetics. Such specialties as archaeology, philosophy, science and textual criticism have amassed an impressive array of arguments in defense of the veracity of Christianity as presented in the Bible. What role do these extra-biblical arguments play in generating faith in a person's heart?

The teaching of the Bible is that faith is produced by Scripture alone. Paul wrote, "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ" (Rom. 10:17 NIV).

Do then extra-biblical apologetic arguments play any role in creating faith? I believe that they do, indirectly. Consider this illustration. Wheat is produced only through wheat seed. For a field to produce a wheat harvest, wheat seed must be planted in it. However, a field isn't prepared to receive the wheat seed until it is first plowed. The plowing isn't directly responsible for the wheat harvest; the harvest is the direct result of the seed. However, the field wouldn't have produced the wheat harvest had it not been plowed first.

Plowing the soil illustrates the role of apologetics. It prepares peoples' hearts to receive Scripture as the word of God. It is pre-evangelism, if you will. No one believes through apologetics alone; faith comes through Scripture. However, apologetics is a very valuable tool in leading a person toward faith. How thankful we should be that so many people have spent so much time and energy to prove through apologetics that the message of Scripture isn't a man-made fable, but is a reasonable account of events rooted in history.
